#### 1. Departmental Committee

#### i) Objectives

- a) To bring a qualitative change in the academic atmosphere by bringing the teacher and the taught closer to each other
- b) To review the academic performance of the students to effect a midcourse intervention in case of students with learning difficulties.
- c) To plan for the academic and extension activities

### ii) The context

Due the paradigm shift in the educational scenario, it is imperative that the problems of the students are understood and addressed effectively. A platform in which students and teachers sitting together, reviewing the progress of the academic activities is the need of the hour.

#### iii) Practice

Against the above background, the concept of department committee is evolved wherein the teachers offering the various courses, and two students representatives from each class form a committee, of which a senior teacher from some other department will be the chairman. The committee is expected to meet twice in a semester with the first one being a diagnostic meeting and the second one will being a therapeutic one. The committee will discuss the coverage of syllabus, performance of the students and difficulties faced by the students, besides analysing the need and wishes of the students.

#### iv) Evidence of success

The concept of departmental committee has brought to light the difficulties faced by the students and the facilities required by them. The teachers and students are able to understand each other, which results in the creation of classroom climate.

#### v) Problems encountered and resources required

The department meeting genuinely list out the various infrastructure and support facility needed for staff and students. But since GRI being fully funded institute, due to various reasons adequate financial resources could not be generated. Immediate needs of the students also could not be addressed if they involve huge financial commitment.

To conclude the department committee meeting serve as a right forum to create excellent academic ambience in the institute.

#### 2. Friday Inter-Religious Prayer

#### **Objectives:**

- 1. To bring religious tolerance in the minds of students and staff
- 2. To bring about communal unity among the members of Gandhigram Community
- 3. To make students learn to respect sentiments of others
- 4. To congregate every week to discuss the activities and achievements of staff and students

#### **Context:**

In the recent years it has become a common thing to note that the religious and communal divides do not spare even educational institutions. Efforts are being taken all over the country to faster unity among the people of various religions and communities. In this context, efforts are being augmented to inculcate the strength of communal unity and harmony in the younger minds.

#### **Practice:**

Gandhigram Rural Institute, being an institution based on Gandhian ideals, practices the Mahathma Gandhi's concept of inter-religious prayer. Students and Staff of the institute assemble at the auditorium every Friday after the classes are over. Songs and Quotes from various religions form the major portion of the prayer. A brief account of the activities of various departments in the preceding week is presented. The prayer is conducted every week by rotation among the departments. Often experts and visitors to Gandhigram Rural Institute address the staff and students. Usually the prayer ends with Ram Dhun. The Friday evening prayer meeting not only serves the purpose of community prayer but also serves as a platform to get to know the happenings in the campus.

#### **Evidence of Success:**

Gandhigram Rural Institute providing a value based education, has been practicing this Friday community prayer from the inception. Visitors and experts coming to Gandhigram Rural Institute are lured by the sight of entire Gandhigram community assembling in one place.

#### **Problems Encountered and Resources Required:**

Since the institute has grown over the years, it has become difficult to collect all the happenings and bring it to the notice of staff and students.

To conclude, the Friday inter-religious prayer serves as a right forum to create the right ambience for imparting the value based education.
