About GRI

Gandhigram Rural Institute (GRI), founded by two dedicated disciples and contemporaries of Mahatma Gandhi, Dr.G.Ramachandran and Dr.T.S.Soundaram Ramachandran, has as its foundation Mahatma Gandhi's revolutionary philosophy of NaiTalim, which effectively bridges the cognitive and practical dimensions, and focuses on the holistic development of learners, with an emphasis on skill development through value-based education, rooted in indigenous cultures and traditions. Since its establishment in 1956, GRI has been unstintingly contributing to higher education and has successfully pioneered rural higher education. The Institute which is administered by the Ministry of Education, Government of India and fully funded through UGC, New Delhi has developed academic programs in rural development, rural economics and extension education, rural oriented sciences, cooperation, development administration, rural sociology, English, Tamil and Indian languages. The institute runs B.Tech. in civil engineering M.Tech. enewable energy. The institute also offers B.Sc Agriculture program. The three dimensional approach of education namely teaching, research and extension has become a highly celebrated model, earning global and nationwide appreciation. Started in a small way the Institute has evolved into a reasonably large and expansive educational complex comprising of 8 schools, 19 departments and 9 Centres offering a whopping 61 academic programs, ranging from certificate courses, to Graduate programmes to Doctoral and Post-Doctoral Programmes. At present the Institute has around 4000 students, including Ph.D. Scholars, and 178 teaching and 243 non-teaching staff. The curricular model developed at GRI organically integrating teaching, research and extension has earned the Institute, the status of Deemed University in 1976 by UGC, the five-star status by NAAC in 2002, 'A' Grade during the re-accreditation in 2010 by NAAC and 'A' Grade in its third cycle of reaccreditation in the year 2016.

About Department of Cooperation

The Department of Cooperation was established in 1956 along with GRI, one of the oldest Departments in Gandhigram Rural Institute. It is the first of its kind in offering Cooperation as an academic discipline at the University level in India with the basic objective of developing manpower with updated knowledge and skill in managing, facilitating, organizing, and revitalizing cooperatives. The thrust areas of teaching, research and extension includes cooperative governance and empowerment, cooperative law and administration, rural finance and cooperative banking, agro-processing and marketing cooperatives, consumer cooperatives and consumer protection, new generation cooperatives, cooperative education, training and extension.

The Department is offering UG and PG Programmes, viz., B.Com. (Hons.) Cooperation and M.Com (Cooperative Management) respectively. The Department introduced Doctoral Programme in the year 1985 onwards. The Faculty members of the Department are mentoring UGC, ICSSR funded Post-Doctoral Fellows (PDF) and have also undertaken sponsored research projects with financial assistance from University Grants Commission (UGC), ICSSR, NCDC, Coconut Development Board, Tamil Nadu Planning Commission. The Faculty members are involved in the monitoring and evaluation of Rural Development Programmes and Special Schemes of the Ministry of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj and Ministry of Water & Sanitation, Government of India with its strong academic and field based research capabilities.

The Department has seven faculty members who have over the years developed expertise in the subjects of Cooperation and Cooperative Management.

About the Conference

With this backdrop, it is proposed to hold a two-day conference on Cooperatives for Inclusive and Sustainable Growth - Challenges and Prospects. It is of paramount importance to discuss and deliberate on the major theme.

In this background, this conference will provide an effective platform for the Academicians, Practitioners, officials, cooperators, Research Scholars to share their findings, ideas, and it also provides an opportunity to young researchers and students to get informed about the role played by cooperatives organization in attaining inclusive and sustainable growth.
