

The corresponding score for each response is coded as "Excellent = 4 points", "Very Good = 3 points", "Good = 2 points" and "Satisfactory = 1 point". The collected data is being systematically analysed, reviewed, and interpreted by the IQAC. The report of feedback analysis for the year 2019-2020 is presented below.







Stakeholders Feedback on Curriculum for 2019-2020

The consolidated feedback analysis report of 2019 - 2020 presents the evaluation of the curriculum based on the feedbacks received from different stakeholders like Students, Teachers, Alumni, Parents, Academic Peers and Employers. The aim was to provide insights into the strengths and areas for improvement in the curriculum. The inferences of the feedback analysis are furnished herein under.

- A. Students feedback with the average curriculum score of 3.69, endorsing their satisfaction on the curriculum. Their score confirms that the curriculum framework has appreciable relevance to industry as well as the society, thereby providing ample scope to assimilate knowledge and skills to meet the demands of the industry and holistically contribute nation building.
- B. Teachers in their feedback on curriculum have expressed their satisfaction over the curriculum structure, which is meticulously designed to achieve the programme wise learning outcomes they have also substantiated that the relevance, content and prescription of learning resources of the programme-wise courses are satisfactory. Further, their feedback had appraised the composition of theory, practical and other programmes-specific components of the curriculum, the average curriculum score of the teachers is 3.67 and it depicts the overall satisfaction of the teachers on the curricular aspects.
- C. Alumni in their feedback have vouched that the potential for academic flexibility core and soft skills development for employability, multidisciplinary learning are highly satisfactory. The average curriculum score of the alumni is recorded as 3.70
- D. Parents are observed to be highly satisfied about the mechanics of knowledge dissemination, learning resources and the teaching learning practices relevant to the curriculum, which is endorsed by their average score of 3.25.

E. Academic peer who are associated with the curriculum design and revision have given their

feedback, It implies that the overall curriculum framework, scope for employability and upward

mobility and credit distribution is very satisfactory. Their degree of satisfaction on the various

aspects of curriculum is underscored by the average score of 3.69.

F. Employer who experience the direct impact on the employability potential, coping skills of our

graduates, have given their feedback on the various aspects of curriculum framework and design.

Their average score of 3.38 confirm on the salient merits of the curriculum from their perspective.

Moreover, this feedback analysis provides insights into the prominent aspects of curriculum that

require attention and improvement in the subsequent revision.

It is apparent that the feedback score of these stakeholders range between 3.25 and 3.70,

against the maximum score of 4.0 these scores typically indicate both the strength of the curriculum

and the scope for objective enrichment.

The prominent suggestions drawn out of this feedback analysis are listed below:

• The graduating students are to be made industry ready through special lectures on the

expectation of the employers.

• The institute may establish more functional collaboration with the potential and prospective

employers for providing hands-on training, On the Job training as well as to offer programme

specific suggestions for curriculum revision.

• The curriculum framework should provide the students broader scope more of practice-based

learning through practicals, field study, project-based learning, participatory learning, case

studies to augment and validate their theoretical knowledge.

• Special efforts are to be taken to foster the employment potential of the graduates through

rigorous training on improving provision for soft skills, professional skills, emotional

intelligent etc, and thereby preparing each graduate, industry-ready.

The salient aspects of the feedback collected from the said stakeholders were discussed in detail

in the IQAC meeting held on 04/11/2020 and the report was submitted to the Vice- Chancellor, GRI, for

necessary directions and action.

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
