


### Assessment Year: 2021-2022

As part of its quality monitoring and maintenance efforts, the IQAC has gathered curriculum feedback for the year 2021-2022 from various stakeholders, including students, teachers, alumni, academic peers, and employers. This feedback was collected using a Four-point Likert Scale Questionnaire via online software. The questionnaire consists of ten questions with four possible responses: "Excellent," "Very Good," "Good," and "Satisfactory." Each response is assigned a score: "Excellent" = 4 points, "Very Good" = 3 points, "Good" = 2 points, and "Satisfactory" = 1 point. The IQAC is currently analyzing, reviewing, and interpreting the collected data. Below is the report on the feedback analysis for the year 2021-2022.


#### **Students Feedback on Curriculum in Percentage**





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#### Stakeholders Feedback on Curriculum for 2021-2022

The comprehensive feedback analysis report for the academic year 2021-2022 offers an evaluation of the curriculum based on input from various stakeholders, including students, teachers, alumni, parents, academic peers, and alumni's employers. The goal is to provide insight into the curriculum's strengths and areas needing improvement. The score is based on average score of 4.0 for each question

**A.** The average feedback score from students is 3.69, indicating overall satisfaction with the curriculum implied that the student gained knowledge skills required to meet industry demand.

**B.** Teachers expressed high satisfaction with the curriculum, which they described as well-structured and aligned with specific program outcomes. They praised the balance between theoretical and practical content, as well as the relevance of course materials and resources. Their feedback resulted in an average score of 3.68.

**C.** Alumni gave an average score of 3.71, expressing their satisfaction with the curriculum's flexibility, multidisciplinary approach, and its role in fostering both core and soft skills that enhance employability.

**D.** Parents rated their satisfaction at 3.70, reflecting their approval of the curriculum's teaching methods, learning resources, and overall approach to knowledge dissemination.

**E.** Academic peers involved in curriculum development gave an average score of 3.70. They highlighted the curriculum's robust structure, its focus on employability, and the effective distribution of credits.

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**F.** Employers rated the curriculum with an average score of 3.50, acknowledging its role in producing employable graduates with key coping skills. They also identified areas for improvement in future curriculum revisions.

The feedback scores from all stakeholders ranged between 3.50 and 3.71, underscoring both the strengths of the curriculum and potential areas for improvement.

Key recommendations include:

- Equip students for the industry by offering specialized lectures on employer expectations and job prospects.
- Partner with employers to offer practical, on-the-job training and gather feedback for curriculum updates.
- Increase practice-based learning opportunities through labs, fieldwork, project-based activities, and case studies.
- Emphasize the development of students' soft skills, professional competencies, and emotional intelligence to better prepare them for the workforce.

These suggestions were discussed at the IQAC meeting on 23/12/2022, and the report was submitted to the Vice-Chancellor of GRI for further action.

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
