





This feedback was collected using a Four-point Likert Scale Questionnaire administered through online software. The questionnaire consists of ten questions with four possible responses: "Excellent," "Very Good," "Good," and "Satisfactory." Each response is assigned a score: "Excellent" = 4 points, "Very Good" = 3 points, "Good" = 2 points, and "Satisfactory" = 1 point. The IQAC is in the process of systematically analyzing, reviewing, and interpreting the data collected. The report on the feedback analysis for the year 2022-2023 is outlined below.



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Stakeholders Feedback on Curriculum for 2022-2023

The detailed feedback analysis for the academic year 2022-2023 provides an assessment of the curriculum based on responses from diverse stakeholders, including students, teachers, alumni, parents, academic peers, and employers. The objective is to highlight the curriculum's strengths and pinpoint areas for enhancement, with average scores out of 4.0 given for each feedback item.

A. Students the average score given by students is 3.69, reflecting their general satisfaction with the curriculum. This score highlights the curriculum's relevance to both industry and societal needs, equipping students with the knowledge and skills necessary to meet professional demands.

B. Teachers reported a high level of satisfaction with the curriculum, rating it as well-organized and aligned with program-specific learning outcomes. They appreciated the balance between theoretical knowledge and practical application, as well as the relevance of course materials. Their feedback led to an average score of 3.68.

C. Alumni provided an average score of 3.70, expressing their approval of the curriculum's flexibility, interdisciplinary focus, and its contribution to the development of both core and soft skills, which improve employability.

D. Parents satisfaction was rated at 3.70, indicating their approval of the methods of teaching, available learning resources, and the overall quality of knowledge dissemination within the curriculum.

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E. Academic peers involved in curriculum design and revision gave an average score of 3.70. They noted the curriculum's strong framework, emphasis on employability, and effective credit distribution.

F. Employers rated the curriculum at 3.70, recognizing its role in preparing graduates with essential skills for employment. They also highlighted areas for improvement in future curriculum revisions.

The feedback scores from all stakeholders ranged between 3.68 and 3.70, underscoring both the strengths of the curriculum and potential areas for improvement.

Key recommendations include:

- Introducing industry-focused workshops and mentoring sessions led by professionals to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-world applications.
- Strengthening partnerships with industries for offering internships, live projects, and co-op programs that provide students with hands-on experience.
- Encouraging interdisciplinary projects and fostering collaborative learning environments to enhance practical and research skills.
- Enhancing career counseling services and placement support to better align with industry trends and student aspirations.
- Incorporating advanced training programs on leadership, entrepreneurship, and innovation to boost professional competencies among graduates.

These recommendations were discussed at the IQAC meeting held on 28/07/2023 and the report was submitted to the Vice-Chancellor of GRI for appropriate action.

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
