



As part of the institution's quality monitoring and sustainability efforts, the IQAC collected curriculum feedback for the 2019-2020 academic year from various stakeholders, including students, teachers, alumni, academic peers, and employers. This feedback was gathered using a four-point Likert scale questionnaire administered via online software. The questionnaire featured ten questions, with response options ranging from "Excellent," "Very Good," "Good," to "Satisfactory." The corresponding scores for these responses were: "Excellent" = 4 points, "Very Good" = 3 points, "Good" = 2 points, and "Satisfactory" = 1 point. The IQAC has thoroughly analyzed, reviewed, and interpreted the feedback data, and the analysis report for 2023-2024 is presented below.

Students Feedback on Curriculum in Percentage (Total No. of Respondents: 1355)



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Stakeholders Feedback on Curriculum for 2023-2024

The comprehensive feedback analysis for the academic year 2023-2024 evaluates the curriculum based on input from various stakeholders, including students, teachers, alumni, parents, academic peers, and employers. The purpose is to identify the strengths of the curriculum and areas for improvement, with average scores out of 4.0 provided for each group.

A. Students gave an average score of 3.69, indicating overall satisfaction with the curriculum. This score reflects the curriculum's alignment with both industry and societal needs, providing students with the skills and knowledge required to meet professional expectations.

B. Teachers expressed a high level of satisfaction, awarding the curriculum an average score of 3.67. They praised its structure and alignment with program-specific outcomes, as well as the balance between theory and practical application, and the relevance of course materials.

C. Alumni rated the curriculum with an average score of 3.70, approving its flexibility, interdisciplinary nature, and contribution to the development of core and soft skills, which enhance employability.

D. Parents reported a satisfaction level of 3.70, indicating their approval of the teaching methods, learning resources, and overall dissemination of knowledge within the curriculum.

E. Academic peers involved in curriculum development provided an average score of 3.68. They highlighted the strong curriculum framework, its emphasis on employability, and the effective distribution of credits.

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F. Employers gave the curriculum an average score of 3.70, acknowledging its role in equipping graduates with essential skills for employment. They also suggested areas for improvement for future revisions.

The overall feedback scores from stakeholders ranged between 3.67 and 3.70, highlighting the curriculum's strengths and areas for enhancement.

Key recommendations include:

- Introduce interactive sessions with industry experts and professionals to provide real-world insights, helping students align with current industry standards.
- Strengthen partnerships with local and national employers to provide more internship opportunities and real-world training programs.
- Develop cross-disciplinary projects and workshops to enhance practical skills and teamwork while addressing industry-relevant problems.
- Implement more robust career development programs that include leadership training, public speaking, and networking skills to help students transition seamlessly into the workforce.

These suggestions were discussed during the IQAC meeting on 06/06/2024 and the report was submitted to the Vice-Chancellor of GRI for further action.
